

# POLICY FOR MEDICAL COLLEGES/ DENTAL COLLEGES IN PRIVATE SECTOR

## 1. Health facility in Rajasthan

1.1 Rajasthan now has a vast network of medical and health institutions both in the rural and the urban areas of the state. There are 219 hospitals, 19 of which have a bed strength over 300 each, 29 hospitals have bed strength between 150-299 and 72 hospitals range from 50 to 149 beds while the remaining 99 hospitals have a bed strength of less than 50 beds. Each district and Sub district hospital provides a wide range of curative care and diagnostic services. The specialty services, such as cardiology, neurology, nephrology, gastroenterology, etc. have been provided in the six Medical College hospitals. Medical services to the scattered population are provided through mobile surgical units.

## 2. Medical Education and Training

2.1 Human resource development is key to the working of the health system. There are six medical colleges and one Dental College in the State with an annual intake capacity of 640 students. About 338 doctors undergo postgraduate training and 72 doctors post graduate diploma in various specialties. There is an Ayurvedic College which trains GO vaidyas every year. 2.2 The growth of medical establishment in the State is quite impressive. In 1951 in public sector the State had only 725 medical doctors. By 1999-2000 there number has increased to over 6184. As a result, the doctor population ratio has significantly improved from 1 doctor per 22069 population to 1 doctor per 7116 population during this period.

2.3 Various Committees have recommended that there should be one medical college for a population of 5 million, it means that the State by 2001 AD would need minimum 11 medical colleges. Doctor population ratio of 1 :3500 is recommended and to achieve this level by 2001 AD, the State would require about 25000 Doctors. This can be achieved only by establishing new Medical/Dental Colleges in the private sector.

2.4 The universal primary health care continues to be highest priority of the Government as part of its commitment for "Health For All" year 2000 AD. Due to epidemiologic transition metabolic disorders, degenerative diseases, chronic diseases such as cancer, heart diseases, etc. are emerging as health problems of public health importance it is imperative to develop a good secondary level care system and super specialty services.

2.5 Rapidly increasing cost of medicare is making it difficult for the Government system to provide the needed services by itself. Rising demand for good medicare necessitates the involvement of the private sector in health care, especially in creating necessary professionals, development of specialty services and diagnostic facilities in the State. The involvement of the private sector besides providing relief to fully stretched out public health care system would also help in improving the quality of services due to its easy access and better client orientation.

2.6 With the aforesaid objectives the Government of Rajasthan wishes to involve the private sector in augmenting the availability of doctors and medical facilities in the state and towards this purpose a policy for private sector participation in Medical and Dental education has been announced.

- 2.7 This policy is aimed to attract investors to set up Medical and Dental Colleges in private sector in the State.

### 3.0 Policy Guidelines

3.1 The Empowered Committee for establishment of Medical and Dental Colleges in private sector, in pursuance of the cabinet decision on the subject No.67/97 dated 7.8.1997 recommended that essentiality certificate cum NOC for establishment of Medical College/Dental College in private sector in the State will be issued by the Sub Committee of the administrative department on the following conditions:-

1. Undertaking from the applicant organisation to-
  - (a) follow MCI/DCI directives and norms;
  - (b) follow directives/judgments of Supreme-Court regarding fee and other aspects of admissions;
  - (c) establish College & Hospital in a given time frame;
  - (d) agree to selection/admission criteria as laid down by State Govt. MCI and DCI;
  - (e) have sufficient funds for development and guarantees,
2. Only eligible applications will be forwarded to MCI/DCI/MOHFW
3. No individual organisation will be issued EC directly, State will direct forward suitable applications to MOHFW/MCJ/DCI.
4. All relevant documents are enclosed.
5. No grant-in-aid would be available through/by State Govt.
6. Applicant organisation has sufficient land for establishment.
7. Development and expansion of College and Hospital, under its ownership.
8. The selection/admission to MBBS/BDS courses will be made from the merit list prepared by the State Gov through-common Entrance Test for FREE as well as "Payment Seats",  
  
Private Medical/Dental Colleges shall be permitted to admit the NRIV foreign students up-to a maximum of 15% of the total sanctioned intake capacity This will be out of payment seats. The management, however, will have its discretion of 15% of the total intake in their colleges and hospitals to be admitted against payment seats without any tests.
9. Subsequent deviations from norms and delays will be communicated to MOHFW, GOI to withdraw permission and / or to MCI/DCI to withhold permission/recognition.
10. Government directions issued from time to time will be followed.

3.2 The Sub Committee of the administrative department will look into the following aspects before forwarding the cases with the EC cum NOC to the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, GOI.

1. Detailed information regarding organisation,
2. Availability of land with organisation,
3. Availability of hospital (Minimum 300 beds for Medical College / 100 beds for Dental College with scope for expansion),
4. Associates of organisation from field of
  - (a) Medical Sciences

- (b) Administration/Management
- (c) Financial Management
- 5. Capital assets, recurrent income and project funding sources.
- 6. Proposed annual intake
- 7. Medical Experts on Management Committee of proposed institution
- 8. Undertaking to be submitted
- 9. Authorisation letters issued to bankers, for making relevant finance related enquiries.
- 10. Desired enclosures

**4.0 Application procedure:**

- 4.1 Applicant will submit an application in prescribed format to the Sub Committee. The application forms are available free of cost at Medical, Health & FW Department, Government of Rajasthan, Jaipur.

**5. Incentives & facilities:**

No land will be allotted to any private Medical/Dental College or its attached hospital. The fiscal benefits shall be available to hospitals to attach to private Medical/Dental Colleges as per the provisions under the policy for private investment in Medical institutions, 1996.
